On the other hand can you think of a decision that turned out really well because you paused and asked questions of yourself or others? Share about that.
- 3. What makes the salesperson in your head so convincing? Why do you know better but don't decide better?
- 4. Read <u>Proverbs 27:12</u>. Have you ever "seen trouble coming" but kept moving in that direction anyway? Alternatively, have you "seen trouble coming" and taken refuge? What made the difference?
- 5. When have you based a decision solely on your immediate happiness or gratification? Describe the decision and the result.
- 6. What is one decision you have made that you think will affect future generations?
- 7. Do you agree that there's not a correlation between what you know and what you do? Why or why not?
- 8. When have you sold yourself on a really bad idea? What was your logic for proceeding with it at the time and what was the outcome?
- 9. Do you agree that "Your decisions determine the direction and quality of your life?" Why or why not?
- 10. How would explain and teach Proverbs 27:12 to young children? Teenagers?
